ABOUT THE BOY FROM OZ

The groundbreaking success of The Boy from Oz, marking the first Australian musical to triumph on Broadway, resonated profoundly both Down Under and in the international theater scene. Led by the remarkable Todd McKenney as Peter Allen, the production garnered numerous awards in Australia. Upon its Broadway debut in 2004, The Boy from Oz earned five Tony Award nominations, a testament to its excellence, including a triumphant win for Best Actor in a Musical by the charismatic Hugh Jackman.

This captivating musical delves into the extraordinary life of the iconic singer/songwriter Peter Allen, unfolding from his humble birth in 1944 in Tenterfield, NSW, to his formative years in rural Armidale. The narrative traces Allen's meteoric ascent to international stardom, exploring his notable career in both Australia and the United States. The production sheds light on his significant relationships with legendary figures such as Judy Garland and Liza Minnelli, culminating in his untimely death in 1992.

The Boy from Oz seamlessly intertwines Peter Allen's renowned songs with the tapestry of his life story, offering a musical journey through hits like "Not the Boy Next Door," "Quiet Please, There's a Lady on Stage," "Everything Old is New Again," "I Honestly Love You," "Don't Cry Out Loud," "Tenterfield Sadler," "I Still Call Australia Home," and "I Go to Rio." Theatrical values inclusivity and diversity in all aspects of its theatre-making. We commit to casting all roles in a conscious and representative manner. We invite performers from all backgrounds, cultural groups, ethnicity, gender identity, physicality and sexual orientation to audition for the roles in this show. Our audition process is open and accessible; we welcome a diverse range of performers to become involved in this show, so that our work can reflect the diversity of people groups across Australia. Theatrical is committed to ensuring that the auditions, rehearsals, pre-production process, and performances are safe, inclusive, supportive and welcoming for all our talent and crew.

AUDITION SCHEDULE & RUNDOWN

We request all auditionees to complete the audition registration form online (<u>theatrical.com.au/auditions</u>). Please upload a copy of your current headshot and a performance CV. You do not need to bring a hard copy of your application form, headshot or resume to the audition.

VOCAL AND ACTING AUDITIONS

Venue: Theatrical HQ, 14 Friendship Square Cheltenham

Each audition is an 8 minute time slot. Please arrive at least 15 minutes before your booked audition time. If you are running late, please sms us on 0448 122 777. Whilst we will make every effort to adhere to the schedule, the auditions may inevitably run over time so please aim to be onsite for at least 30-45 minutes.

Vocal Audition

Please prepare two contrasting songs (16-bar cuts), an up tempo song and a ballad, in the style of the show. Please do not sing a song from the show. You may not be required to present your selected songs in their entirety, however, be prepared to perform both cuts during the audition. We request that you prepare sheet music (in a clear display folder, in the correct key, with tempo and cut markings) for the audition pianist. You will have an opportunity to talk through your songs with the pianist before your audition. You may bring your own piano accompanist if you prefer. We ask for all song cuts to be performed with live accompaniment, no backing tracks.

If you are auditioning for the Dance Troupe only (a non-singing role) you do not need to book a vocal or acting audition.

Acting Auditions

We may ask you to perform the audition monologue that is included in this document. You are welcome to bring a hard copy of the monologue into the audition room.

DANCE AUDITION (by invitation)

You may be required to attend a dance audition. All performers, who wish to be considered for roles in this production, must make themselves available for the dance call upon request.

CALL-BACK AUDITIONS

Date: Monday 8 April from 7pm @ Theatrical HQ

We will notify you if you are required to attend a call-back. We may call-back some roles, however, if you do not receive a call-back, you may still be in consideration. We will notify all auditionees of the outcome of their audition.

We will send you additional material when we notify you of a call-back request. During call backs you will be asked to perform song cuts & dialogue from the show. You may be grouped with other auditionees to test chemistry. We are looking for authentic performers who make bold offers, are collaborative, and support each other throughout the audition, rehearsal, and performance phases. If you receive a call-back and cannot attend at the scheduled time, please let us know by contacting us via email (prod@theatrical.com.au).

Note that call backs for Peter Allen cover and Young Peter Allen will also be required to play the piano.

Please note: You will be required for all rehearsals. If you have any unavailability during the rehearsal & performance period, please advise us of these dates & times in your audition form. We also ask that you notify us of any other prior commitments which may impact your attendance at rehearsals/performances. A detailed rehearsal schedule will be provided to you at the induction night.

Costume fittings will be scheduled to coincide with rehearsal times where possible. We will negotiate times with you if additional costume fittings are required.

CHARACTERS DESCRIPTIONS

PETER ALLEN (COVER)

Male presenting, Contemporary vocal (top G)

Actor/Singer/Dancer, Oozing charisma and energy. The ultimate 'Showman', very ambitious.

<u>Stage Age</u>:Due to the Show time transitions the character ages from mid 20's onwards; age to look on stage is late 20's to 40 years old.

<u>Vocal Range</u>:Middle C -A (above staff), (Bb Falsetto)

Dance: Strong

NB: The role of Peter Allen has been cast for this production. Please refer to the FAQs for more information about character covers.

THE TRIO: KAREN, SHEENAAND LINELLE. Back Up Girls for PeterAllen Female presenting, Contemporary back up vocalist with belt

These girls are solo artists in their own right. Vocally there will be lots of harmonies; very strong vocal quality and range are required.. Singers/Dancers/Movers:

Stage Age: Open

<u>Vocal Ranges</u>: Three parts sit within a low Eb (below the staff) to a Bb (above the staff). They are Sop 1, Sop 2, Alto arrangements; each part has a large range to allow for solos and scatting. <u>Dance</u>: Good movers

JUDY GARLAND

Female presenting, Contemporary vocal (low E below middle C)

Memorable, charismatic Movie Star and Stage Diva.. A sensitive and very vulnerable character, but also strong willed

Stage Age: mid 40's. Strong singer/actress. Vocal Range: Eb (below the staff) – A (on the staff) Dance: Strong

LIZA MINNELLI

Female presenting, Contemporary vocal (low F below middle C to D)

A rising star (Judy Garland's daughter) marries Peter Allen. Theatre& Cabaret Artist.Dancer, singer, actress.

<u>Stage Age</u>: around early to mid 20's throughto 30's 40's <u>Vocal Range</u>: F (below the staff) – C# (on the staff) <u>Dancing</u>: Strong

YOUNG PETER ALLEN Male presenting

Peter Allen as an Australian youngster. Singer with good dancing and tapping ability. Clean cut kid with a lot of bravado

<u>Stage Age</u>: approx 9 to 13 years. <u>Vocal Range</u>: Middle C# - D (on the staff) <u>Dancing</u>: Strong (including tap)

MARION WOOLNOUGH

Female presenting, Contemporary vocal (top D)

Peter Allen's Australian mother, down to earth mother type. Strong actress, singer. Character shows a good sense of humour.

Stage Age: 30 to 70 Voice: Contemporary vocal (top D) Dance: Confident mover

GREG CONNELL

Male presenting, Contemporary vocal (top D)

Peter Allen's long term companion. Greg was from Texas and was a fashion model.He designed Peter Allen's shows' sound and lighting after they met. Warm lovable character, quiet with a very dependable personality.

Stage Age: 30 to 40 years old. Vocal Range: Middle C -D(on the staff) Dance: Confident mover

VALERIE ANTHONY (DEE'S WIFE) JOSIE MANN (ARMIDALE PUB OWNER) Female presenting, Stage Age: 30 to 60

DANCE TROUPE

A group of trained and experienced Dancers (to perform as the Rockettes, feature dancers and part of the ensemble). Dance Troupe members should be aged 16 years and over.

AUDITION MONOLOGUE

All auditionee's are expected to learn the following monologue. We may ask you to perform it as part of your audition.

Good natured ladies come and sit, smiling up at me

And backward boys from abroad linger till after 3

And I can see what's never seen; the greatest show that's ever been:

The audience was playing for me

A group of strangers turned to friends acting naturally They're laughing, crying, "take me just where I want to be!"

When I think of times I'd flown the highest, they where times I'd known


The audience was playing for me

FAQ

What can I expect at the audition?

The casting panel comprises the Executive Producer, Director, Musical Director, Musical Supervisor & Casting Consultant. A pianist will be in the room to accompany your singing audition. Our Casting Consultant will be present at the venue to help everyone feel welcome and culturally safe during the casting process.

We know that auditions are challenging. The audition panel commits to conducting auditions in a respectful and supportive manner. We want you to be comfortable during your audition. Please let us know if you have any questions about the auditions.

Casting a show is a complex process which involves placing performers in the roles which suit them best. If you are unsuccessful, we acknowledge this is a disappointing outcome. We can offer feedback on your audition if you would like it. Please reach out to prod@theatrical.com.au with any pre/post audition enquiries.

What can I expect at rehearsals?

As a part of our commitment to creating a safe and collaborative environment, the production team will support you every step of the way. We understand that some of the subject matter of the show may be sensitive, confronting, and/or challenging - we commit to approaching this content with the utmost respect and care. We aim to create an atmosphere that encourages creativity and mutual respect, whilst maintaining professionalism at all times. We believe that open communication is key to the success of our productions.

What are character covers?

To cover for illness etc we may cast a cover/understudy for some of the principal roles. Given the significant commitment involved with learning a principal track we may offer a cover some guaranteed performances in the role that they are understudying.

I'm unavailable for some of the rehearsals. Can I still be involved?

All Cast members are expected to attend every rehearsal unless they are otherwise advised. During the audition process, you will be asked to indicate your unavailability in the audition form. We understand that there may be unforeseen circumstances which may arise and we ask you to maintain an open line of communication with us. Rest assured that our team will provide adequate notice of any updates to schedules throughout the casting and rehearsal process.

My age is different to the Stage Age listed in the Character Descriptions. Can I still be considered for that role?

Stage age is a guide, provided to us from the writes of the show. Whenever possible we try to find performers who can play a character within the recommended stage age range. If you feel that you can play a character within the recommended stage age we would be very happy to see you audition for that role, regardless of your actual age.

FAQ (continued)

If I am cast in this show, can I audition for other shows?

There are a lot of people on and off stage who invest a lot of time and energy into making a Theatrical production. So, we ask everyone involved to make a 100% commitment to the show. If you would like to audition for something else during your time on the show, all we ask is that you discuss it with the production team first, so we can make sure that it doesn't conflict with your commitment to this show.

How much are the show fees?

We won't ask you to pay a show fee.

What is a libretto deposit?

Theatrical has to pay for any damaged or missing libretto/script. So we ask our cast to pay a \$70 deposit, but once you return your hard copy libretto after the show closes we will refund that to you in full by EFT, so long as it is clean and undamaged.

Will I have to sell tickets and fundraise for the show?

We have a great team of fundraisers, marketers, publicists and social media creators who focus on letting people know about our shows. Our cast will never be required to participate in fundraising activities, and there is no pressure to sell tickets (but we hope that you are as proud and excited about the show as we are so tell your family and friends to come and support this work).

Am I expected to help with bump-in and bump-out?

At our final rehearsal at Theatrical HQ you will be expected to help pack everything for transport. And after our closing show we request your help with the bump-out. We use professional removalists for the actual bump-in and bump-out.

What else does Theatrical expect from cast members?

At Theatrical we want our cast focused on developing and presenting a great show. But if you have other skills that you would like to offer, we are always looking for volunteers to help with set building, costumes, scenic artistry and all the other stuff that goes into making great theatrical experiences.

A sense of community is important at Theatrical. You will be invited to social events throughout the season, which we encourage you to attend. It's a great way to get to know the whole Theatrical team.

When will I find out the outcome of my audition?

SMS and phone call offers are made by the production team within 48 hours after call-backs. We ask that you confirm your acceptance within 24 hours after the offer is made. We will notify all candidates of an audition outcome within 3-4 days after call-backs.

Sometimes, auditions and call backs can run longer than expected. If the process takes longer than planned, we apologise in advance for any delays in notifications.
